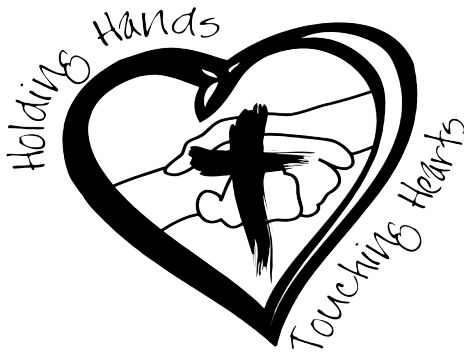

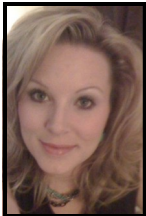
## 2012 Texas District LCMS Early Childhood Conference

#### Jon Bartell: "Science Quest"



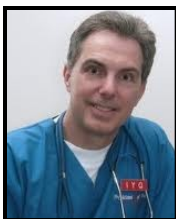
